HIS 2610 African American History to 18773 Credit Hours ESL Placement Level: For English-as-a-Second-Language (ESL) students, placement in ESL 2520.

This course examines the African American experience from the emergence of ancient African kingdoms through the Middle Passage to slavery in the Americas, from the abolitionist movement through the Civil War and Reconstruction. It discusses the evolution of black American slavery as a legal, social, economic and political institution.
