## Certificate

The Transfer Studies Certificate is designed to facilitate the transfer of general education requirements from Oakland Community College to another Michigan college/university. The requirements for this certificate will satisfy the requirements for the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA). Students who transfer to participating institutions with a transcript certified "MTA satisfied" will most likely fulfill all or the majority of the student's lower level general education requirements as determined by the transfer institution.

1. To receive the Transfer Studies Certificate and the MTA endorsement, students must fulfill the requirements noted for each category and successfully complete at least 30 credits. All coursework used to fulfill the requirements must be completed with a grade of 2.0 or higher in each course. Course equivalencies awarded from a College-Level Examination Program (CLEP), a DANTES Subject Standardized Test (DSST) or from an International Baccalaureate (IB) are not eligible for use toward MTA requirements.
2. Students seeking only the MTA endorsement using transfer credits must successfully complete at least 1 credit-bearing nondevelopmental course at OCC. To obtain the Transfer Studies Certificate using transfer credits, students need to complete a minimum of 15 credits at OCC.
3. The MTA endorsement and the Transfer Studies Certificate can be posted to a student's record when all components have been met.

Students should always discuss transfer options with an OCC Counselor as requirements vary by school. Counselors are available to help guide students on the right path toward seeking their academic goals at other colleges and universities.
