GEO 1510 Physical Geography 3 Credit Hours

English/ESL Placement: Placement into ENG 1510.

The course will explain the spatial dimensions of Earth's dynamic system, its energy, air, water, weather, climate, tectonics, landforms, rocks, plants, ecosystems, and biomes. The course examines human-Earth relationships using maps to create a holistic view of the planet and its inhabitants.
